**Gubei Water Town** is located in Simatai Village, Gubeikou Town, Miyun District, Beijing. It is a picturesque tourist resort that blends the atmosphere of northern ancient towns with the charm and layout of southern water towns. •Water Town Wine Distillery: Experience traditional brewing methods.

•Wulong Square and Water Street: Ideal for a peaceful stroll by the rivers and canals.

3. Take a Boat Ride

•Enjoy a relaxing boat ride on the canal, which provides a great view of the town's charming architecture.

4. Lunch in Gubei Water Town

•Have lunch at one of the local restaurants offering traditional northern Chinese cuisine or fresh river fish.

#### Afternoon:

5. Head to Simatai Great Wall

•Hiking or Cable Car to Simatai Great Wall: Choose to hike up to the Wall, which will take about 30-45 minutes, or take the cable car for a more relaxed journey with breathtaking views.
