Visit Tiananmen Square and the Forbidden City

Upon your arrival at Beijing Capital International Airport, your dedicated tour guide, holding a sign with your name, will meet you for your Beijing Layover Tour. After a comfortable drive into Beijing

city, your first stop will be **Tiananmen Square**, one of the largest public squares in the world, capable of holding over a million people for public gatherings. From there, you'll walk straight into the **Forbidden City**, the former imperial palace of 24 Ming (1368–1644) and Qing (1644–1911) emperors. Spanning 72 hectares (180 acres), this UNESCO World Heritage Site is the largest ancient palace complex in the world. The tour of the Forbidden City takes about 2 hours. Afterward, you'll be transferred back to the airport for your departure.
